Early Fire Danger Season...

Due to the nature of the season there is every likelihood that the Fire Danger Season will be brought forward this year from the normal starting date of Dec. 1. It is therefore strongly recommended that all residents take the necessary steps to reduce the hazards around their property well before Fire Danger Season. Start NOW!

Here's what you should do...

- Clean gutters
- Trim overhanging branches
- Remove leaf litter around buildings & trees
- Cut tall grass
- Don't leave wood stacked around house.

Free information...

The local council office has plenty of free information on what can be done - including fire restrictions during Fire Danger Season and evacuation plans.

Hall redevelopment gets the green light...

Many years of quiet persistence and determination have seen a vision for new facilities for the Willunga community come to fruition. Members of Willunga Uniting Church and the wider community gathered on Thursday, September 6th to celebrate the formal handing over of funds for the redevelopment of the Willunga Uniting Church hall. This will assist funds already raised.

A building project to update the heritage hall at Willunga Uniting Church was first mooted in 2001. The mission was to upgrade and redevelop the hall complex. The first meeting was chaired by Jim Pitkin and from that time the committee has worked on developing and refining the plans in liaison with an architect and council.

While planning went on, the small matter of finances was discussed. This seemed insurmountable until research uncovered the Regional Partnership Scheme. Thanks go to Vivienne Goode-nough, Kym McHugh, Colin Haines and other members of the local consultative committee. Thanks must also go to the various community groups who helped by writing letters in support of the project and to the individuals, families and groups that assisted financially and in a variety of ways. This support was not only valuable in its own right, but it also demonstrated that the project was worthy of a financial grant from Regional Partnerships.

It has been a combined effort of many in the Willunga Uniting Church community and wider local support that has seen the success of this project. Thanks go to John Bennett who has prepared a survey report of the hall buildings and has volunteered to oversee the building project; Robyn Clothier who acted as treasurer; Phil Boulden and Eric Hancock who assisted on the committee.

Proposed Shopping Development...

As many locals are aware there is currently a proposal before council to expand the McLaren Vale Shopping Centre to include a 3,300sqm Coles Supermarket, a country Target, 16 specialty stores and 640 car parks. The development is at the council planning dept who are awaiting a report from Transport SA regarding the effect on traffic the development would have if approved. Once this is received the proposal will go before the council's Development Assessment Panel (DAP). There is a great deal of concern within the community regarding a number of issues including the effects on local businesses, traffic concerns, future sustainability, and significant tree removal amongst others. As yet the developer has not directly addressed the community and did not attend the public meeting arranged by Leon Bignell MP in June.

Annual General Meeting Report...

In opening the AGM our **Acting Chairperson, Michael Pacillo** welcomed a gathering of thirty-nine persons present and thanked our Host—Julia Hand for her hospitality and excellent meal.

Michael said he was honoured to have worked in this capacity of Acting Chairperson, but saddened because of the death of our elected Chairperson Rod Easling. A man of great integrity and vision, a person who had so much to offer who left a big gap in our organisation.

He touched on the highs and lows - the success of TDU in January and thanked Kate Fleming & Carolyn Colling who coordinated this event and all the volunteers. The Information Booth which was found too costly to maintain, the Willunga Walking Festival which will be even bigger this year, Fleurieu Folk Club with whom we have been associated, Youth Alliance where we have enrolled two apprentices and have two more ready for enrolment just as soon as funds are available. The Association receives \$1200 for each apprentice, \$200 goes to the Apprentice, \$200 to the Employer.

Michael complimented Rilda & Andrew for their excellent presentation of "In a Nutshell". The Association are using it to present a monthly Newsletter keeping you in touch with happenings.

Peter Trenorden, our retiring Public Officer handled the nominations - two positions to be filled, that of Chairperson and Public Officer. We are delighted to announce that Howard Salkow was nominated and elected to fill both positions. A presentation was made to Peter who was a foundation member of the Association and due to heavy business commitments was unable to continue. Also a presentation and thanks to Ray & Edie Gilbert, our patrons.

Howard Salkow our newly elected Chairperson thanked those present for the confidence in giving him the reins of WTTA. Details re-TDU Committee and his remarks re the progress of the event appear under a "TDU heading".

Howard expressed the importance that nothing can be done alone and what he was presenting involves everyone who has a business and tourism interest in this fine town of ours. Howard went onto say "There is no denying that the thinking among the businesses is that the WTTA is limited in its offerings... and that it does not focus enough on business development. What I am saying is that I am cognisant of the task ahead, and the critical need to turn things around and renew the confidence of the town's businesses. I am also aware that when a new kid on the block enters the fray, people invariably sit back and watch if the individual can deliver and produce real outcomes and results. But it's important to appreciate nothing will happen over night. And equally important, nothing can be done alone and what I am presenting involves everyone who has a business and tourism in this fine town of ours.

Howard's immediate goals include:

1. The creation of a committed management committee that will meet on a regular basis and respond to the needs of the community;
2. These same people talking to the businesses... and listening and learning... and acting upon their needs and wants;
3. Making provision for a City of Onkaparinga councillor serving - ex officio - on our management committee enabling us to be in tune with plans/actions affecting Willunga;
4. Establishing a liaison with Mayor Lorraine Rosenberg and sharing her vision for our future;
5. Maximising opportunities through the Fleurieu Peninsula Tourism Marketing Committee, on which I serve;
6. The creation of a Willunga Brochure - with input and assistance - from across the town - and a website that clearly articulates who and what we are;
7. Maintaining close links with the numerous clubs and associations within the community and how we can complement each other to promote the town;
8. In conjunction with the City of Onkaparinga, the creation of a five-year Business Plan clearly outlining... who we are; what we have to offer; the actions to demonstrate our strengths; and the time frames and cost to achieve this;
9. And in revising our constitution, changing our name to the Willunga Business & Tourism Association.

Howard reiterated, none of this can be achieved alone... it requires the efforts of everyone in the town, he asked for support to give WTTA the chance to turn things around and promised to keep everybody posted - because every body will be a major part of it. 

Last year's Chalkfest was an outdoor music and arts festival for young people in Willunga. This spring however the steering committee made up of young people from the region working with Mission Australia Community Youth Workers, funded by The City of Onkaparinga, have headed in another direction for the local arts event. Willunga Show Hall will be the venue for the screening of a new Amateur Short Film Competition being run by the steering committee.

Working closely with the Media Resource Centre, Adelaide's Film Industry Promoter, the Chalkfest crew will be holding a screening of short films created by local artists. We've promoted the competition in schools and business throughout the Onkaparinga region so we're expecting a good

Friday to Sunday...

Fleurieu Folk Festival is happening in Willunga on the 26-28th October 2007 and it's going to be bigger and better than ever! Nestled at the foot of the southern Adelaide Hills, the historic town of Willunga is the perfect spot to hold a festival. It already hosts the Tour Down Under, Almond Blossom Festival, Willunga Walking Festival, Classic Adelaide Car Rally, Willunga Farmers and Quarry Markets and now the Fleurieu Folk Festival. We'll be cooperating with the whole community to help put Willunga on the map as the Fleurieu Peninsula's "Festival Town".

Fleurieu Folk Festival started in 2003 as a relatively small event held in the grounds of the Aldinga Hotel and utilising the adjacent hall and grounds and nearby sporting clubrooms. The festival has now outgrown this venue – hence the move to Willunga where the Festival will be held at the Recreation Ground utilising the hall complex and marquees and stalls in the surrounds. There will also be events programmed into venues throughout the town – pubs, cafes, village square, etc.

What's Happening...

The action starts at 6pm on Friday with a concert featuring local & guest performers. On Saturday and Sunday continuous concerts and feature events will be held in "The Pavilion", a large marquee adjacent to the Recreation Ground. This will be the main venue and will be set out cabaret style with seating for about 200. There will be a smaller marquee on the nearby "village green" for anyone wishing to try their hand at a "walk-up" blackboard concert.

On Saturday evening there will be a feature concert in the Recreation Ground Stadium to showcase the special guests at this year's Festival - The Borderers, Kvonn (from the Faroe Islands), Claymore, Australia's leading Scottish Celtic folk-rock band and Danny Spooner, one of the best singers of British folksongs in Australia.

Saturday morning and afternoon will feature the Young Talent Showcase, with lots of young locals strutting their stuff on the "village marquee" stage.

Informal sessions will be held all weekend in the Sporting Clubrooms, Session Tent and hotels in the town. There will be a family Bush Dance on Saturday in the Show Hall adjacent to the Stadium. Other events, including the workshops, the bush poet's event and various exhibitions will be held in the Recreation hall complex. There will also be lots of craft and food stalls, children's entertainment and plenty of other action around the Recreation Ground precinct and throughout the town itself.

Peter Thornton, Fleurieu Folk Festival Coordinator: The 4th festival. 3500 attended last festival in Aldinga in 2005. Chose Willunga for expansion. A chance for clubs to make some money from catering for campers and the crowd. A chance for local schools to showcase. No admission charge. Crowd of 5000-8000 is expected over the weekend. Suggested they order in Miniskip. Marquees to be erected on Thursday (*wander down & give a hand*) & the hall open from 4pm on Friday.


